SPECIFIC RULES FOR TREES & SHRUBS and ORNAMENTAL GRASSES & GRASS-LIKE PLANTS EXHIBITS

1. The rules printed herein and the flower show general rules are made a part of the conditions under which all entries are made, and exhibitors are respectfully requested to read them carefully, thereby avoiding confusion at the time of the Fair and to ensure that all entries are in the appropriate class.
2. **The focus of this show is on plants grown primarily for foliage.** Entries must have been grown by the exhibitor for not less than three months.
3. No [New York State Prohibited and Regulated Invasive Plants](#) may be exhibited.
4. Open to amateurs only. Amateurs are growers who do not grow primarily for sale.
5. Exhibits will not be watered during the show.
6. Judging will be based on the following criteria.

Trees and Shrubs, Flowering/Fruiting or Foliage: General Condition and Staging, Cultural Perfection, Rarity or Novelty, Decorative Quality of Form, Foliage and Bark, including all season interest. Quality and Condition of Flowers or Fruit if present.

Ornamental Grasses and Grass-Like Plants: General Condition and Staging, Cultural Perfection, Rarity or Novelty, Quality and Condition.

7. All exhibits must be free of insects and diseases and may be disqualified.

8. Entry tag should show variety name. A named variety entry takes precedence over an equal unnamed variety.
9. No artificially altering or enhancing of entries. (e.g.: no use of dyes, colorings, oils or plant polish).
10. Exhibitors may make several entries in a class, provided such entries are different named varieties.
11. See above for entry placement, judging and removal times. Entries may not be placed before 8:00 a.m. Saturday, August 24 except by permission from the Chair. All entries must be in place before 11:00 a.m. for judging. Entries removed prior to specified time will forfeit prizes.
12. Bloom on plants grown primarily for foliage is permitted. No extra points will be awarded for the flowers.
13. Any class may be subdivided into additional classes with Chair approval if the number of entries of any one plant or variety exceeds three and provided that the resulting class has more than three entries.
14. Exhibits should be less than 36" long unless otherwise specified.
15. Don't forget to register your entries.
